

MARSHALL COUNTY RESOLUTION 2020-21
RESTRICTING PUBLIC ACCESS TO COUNTY BUILDINGS

This policy is developed in response to the COVID-19 Coronavirus emergency and in conformance with the County's Public Health Declaration in Resolution 2020-17.

Effective this date, May 4, 2020, all Marshall County facilities shall remain open to Marshall County employees for the purposes of said employees to continue county work and functions. The following COVID-19 prevention actions are required of all County employees:

1. Separate by 6-feet;
2. Wash and sanitize hands frequently;
3. Do not touch your face;
4. Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze;
5. Mask to be worn when in close contact with other employees or any of the public;
6. If an employee has a temperature, a cough, or feels ill, they shall stay at home;
7. Employees are contagious one (1) day before symptoms and five (5) days after symptoms;
8. It is the employee responsibility to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus;
9. Keep Marshall County safe.

The County Museum and the County Jail shall remain closed to the public. The other facilities shall restrict public access although the building will be open to the public for essential services. The number of individuals permitted into the buildings will be restricted by court and county building security so as to protect the public, county employees, and to ensure that patrons shall exercise social distancing and shall wear a mask. Patrons may be required to remain outside of the Marshall County offices at a safe distance until they can be safely admitted.


